#### TO THE HONORABLE NEW JERSEY BOARD OF PUBLIC UTILITIES:

- 1. **PETITIONER, AQUA NEW JERSEY, INC.** (hereinafter "Petitioner" or the "Company"), a public utility of the State of New Jersey, with its principal business office at 10 Black Forest Road, Hamilton, New Jersey 08691, hereby petitions for approval of a purchased wastewater treatment adjustment clause true-up ("PSTAC") for calendar year 2018 and to set prospective rates for calendar year 2020 pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1 et seq.
- 2. Petitioner's Maxim Wastewater Division ("Maxim") provides wastewater service to approximately 2,583 customers in the Township of Howell, County of Monmouth, pursuant to a municipal consent and franchise, and an Order of the Board of Public Utilities ("Board") approving the franchise and accepting Petitioner's initial tariff for filing.
- 3. Maxim purchases wastewater treatment services from the Ocean County Utilities Authority ("OCUA"). The OCUA treats all of the wastewater collected by Maxim, which is a Bulk Rate customer of the OCUA. Bills are rendered by the OCUA and paid by Maxim on a quarterly basis during the year. In January of each year, the OCUA estimates the annual volume

of wastewater to be treated for Maxim and bills the Company quarterly based on that estimate. In 2018, the OCUA estimated Maxim's annual usage to be 235 million gallons. Also in January of each year, the OCUA reconciles the actual volumes treated for Maxim in the prior calendar year and provides a charge or a credit, depending on Maxim's actual usage, on Maxim's first quarter bill in the following year.

#### PSTAC RECONCILIATION FOR 2018

- 4. As noted above, the purpose of this proceeding is twofold: to true-up actual 2018 PSTAC costs and revenues with estimated costs and revenues for 2018; and to set prospective rates for 2020. The rates that Maxim was authorized to collect in 2018 were set by the Board in Docket No. WR17080871 (dated November 21, 2017), attached as Exhibit A. Specifically, the Board authorized the Company to set 2018 rates to recover costs of approximately \$806,810 (consisting of the following components: estimated 2018 OCUA treatment costs of \$873,708, a credit for the actual \$66,818 PSTAC over-recovery for 2016, a credit for interest of \$2,980 on that over-recovery, and actual costs of \$2,900 related to (half of) the cost of the proceeding).
- 5. On January 31, 2019 the Company received from the OCUA a letter which explained that the 2018 Annual Charge for wastewater treatment was based on Maxim's estimated sewage volume of 235 million gallons, whereas, the actual 2018 volume was 248.300 million gallons, or 13.300 million gallons more than the billed estimate. The increased volume resulted in a deficiency of \$52,688, which was added to the first installment of the 2019 Annual Charge. The OCUA letter and a schedule showing Maxim's actual 2018 metered flow data are attached as Exhibit B, hereto. Therefore, in 2018, Maxim's total actual PSTAC costs were \$983,268: this compares to the projected expense of \$873,708 authorized in BPU Docket No. WR17080871, thus resulting in a \$109,560 under-recovery. The Company's prospective

authorized revenues for 2018 were \$806,810. Maxim's actual revenues in 2018, however, were \$811,468, resulting in an over-recovery of \$4,658. Accordingly, the Company had a total under-recovery of \$104,902.

#### 2020 OCUA RATES

6. On June 27, 2019, the OCUA issued a resolution, following notice and a public hearing, approving the implementation of the Bulk Rate of \$4,039 per million gallons for service rendered in 2020, evidencing no change from the currently effective Bulk Rate. The resolution is attached as Exhibit C.

#### 2020 PSTAC RATES

- 7. Maxim's 2019 PSTAC tariff was approved by Order of the Board in Docket No. WR18080882 (dated December 18, 2018), which is attached as <u>Exhibit D</u>. Attached hereto as <u>Exhibit E</u> is Maxim's existing 2019 PSTAC tariff, and a proposed 2020 PSTAC tariff which incorporates the proposed 2018 PSTAC reconciliation as well as prospective rates for 2020.
- 8. Attached hereto as <u>Exhibit F</u> is a schedule which supports the proposed 2020 PSTAC tariff. As discussed above, the Company's 2020 PSTAC must address the reconciliation of actual 2018 PSTAC revenues and PSTAC expenses with estimated revenues and expenses, and set prospective rates for 2020 to address estimated treatment costs. As noted above, Petitioner has performed a reconciliation of the actual revenues and expenses of the 2018 PSTAC and determined that there was an under-recovery for 2018 of \$104,902. <u>See Exhibit F</u> (pages 1-3).
- 9. With respect to the setting of prospective rates for 2020, Petitioner has performed an analysis of the projected PSTAC costs for calendar year 2020, and estimated 2020 OCUA treatment costs to be \$911,064. See Exhibit F (page 5). Please note that this estimate is based on a three year average of actual total volumes treated (225.6 MG), rather than the higher volumes

(60 MG/quarter or 240 MG annually) the OCUA is using to bill the Company on a quarterly basis. Additionally, as summarized on Exhibit F (page 4), the Company has estimated the cost of this proceeding to be \$10,750 and has included half of that amount, \$5,375, in its request in this proceeding. As indicated on Exhibit F (page 7), the Company has estimated that its total PSTAC revenue requirement for 2020 is \$1,021,341 (which includes \$911,064 of estimated 2020 treatment costs, plus \$5,375 for the costs of this proceeding, plus \$104,902 for the 2018 PSTAC under-recovery reconciliation.

- Docket No. WR18080882 and 2019 PSTAC revenues are estimated to be approximately \$812,077. When the 2020 PSTAC revenue requirement is compared to the level of PSTAC revenues estimated for 2019, there is a revenue deficiency of \$209,264 (calculated on Exhibit F, page 7). As summarized on Exhibit F (page 9), the Company has developed a 2020 PSTAC rate to recover a total of \$1,021,341 in 2020 PSTAC revenues. As illustrated on Exhibit F (page 8), the increase in the 2020 revenue requirement of \$1,021,341 (when compared to current rates) results in an across-the-board increase in the present PSTAC rate of approximately 25.769%.

#### BY THE BOARD:

On August 10, 2017, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1 et seq., Aqua New Jersey, Inc., Maxim Wastewater Division ("Maxim," "Company," or "Petitioner") filed a verified petition with the Board of Public Utilities ("Board") for approval of a Purchased Sewerage Treatment Adjustment Clause ("PSTAC") true-up for calendar year 2016, and to set prospective rates for calendar year 2018 (as required by N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.7). The Company originally filed for rates under the current PSTAC to remain unchanged. The 2017 PSTAC revenues at present rates are approximately \$845,375.

Maxim is a wastewater utility engaged in the collection and transmission of sewage. Maxim serves approximately 2,572 customers within a portion of Howell Township, Monmouth County, New Jersey. The Ocean County Utilities Authority ("OCUA") receives and treats all of the sewage transmitted by Maxim.

By this Order, the Board considers the Stipulation of Settlement ("Stipulation") executed by the Petitioner, the Division of Rate Counsel ("Rate Counsel") and Board Staff ("Staff") (collectively, the "Parties"), agreeing to an overall decrease in Petitioner's PSTAC revenues of approximately 27.36% below current PSTAC revenues of \$845,375.

#### BACKGROUND/PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The matter was retained by the Board and since the Company did not seek an increase in rates, it was deemed that a public comment hearing was not required.

Petitioner's rates reflect the recovery of wastewater treatment charges imposed by the OCUA. The current PSTAC tariff was approved by the Board in an Order in Docket No. WR16080737, dated November 30, 2016, which examined PSTAC revenues and expenses applicable to the period ending December 31, 2015 and set prospective rates for calendar year 2017.

In this proceeding, the Parties engaged in discovery and have examined the Company's actual revenues and actual OCUA expenses for calendar year 2016, the Company's projected OCUA expenses for 2018, as well as the costs of this proceeding. The Parties participated in a settlement conference on October 31, 2017, reached a settlement on all issues, and subsequently entered into a Stipulation. Based on the foregoing, the Parties have determined that the current PSTAC rate should be decreased to recover \$38,565 less in revenues. The \$38,565 PSTAC decrease was calculated based on the following components:

- a) an over-recovery of actual wastewater treatment charges of approximately \$66,818 for the calendar year ending December 31, 2016 (<u>See</u> Exhibit A, attached hereto, pages 1 to 3), with the interest on this over-recovery calculated to be \$2,980 (See Exhibit A, page 11);
- b) projected OCUA charges for 2018 of \$873,708 based on OCUA rates effective for 2017 (See Exhibit A, page 5);
- c) the total costs of this proceeding are deemed to be \$5,800 (See Exhibit A, page 4). These costs will be shared 50/50 between ratepayers and shareholders, resulting in a cost to customers of \$2,900 (See Exhibit A, page 7); and
- d) the pro forma PSTAC revenues at current rates are projected to be \$845,375 (See Exhibit A, page 6).

As required in N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.7 and the Board's Order in Docket No. WR15080864, the Petitioner has included in its filing an estimate of OCUA costs for calendar year 2018, which has been used to determine the applicable PSTAC rate for 2018.

#### DISCUSSIONS AND FINDINGS<sup>1</sup>

Based on the estimated costs for 2018, the over-recovery for 2016 (including interest), and the costs of this proceeding, the Parties have agreed that Petitioner's current PSTAC rates on file with the Board should be decreased as indicated on Exhibit A. For the average residential customer, the total annual flat PSTAC rate will decrease from \$319.09 to \$304.53, or approximately 4.56%.

Having reviewed the record in this matter, as well as the Stipulation among the Parties, the Board <u>HEREBY FINDS</u> that the Stipulation among the Parties is reasonable, in the public interest and is in accordance with the law.

Therefore, the Board <u>HEREBY ADOPTS</u> the Stipulation attached hereto, including all attachments and schedules, as its own, incorporating by reference the terms and conditions of the Stipulation, as if fully set forth at length herein, subject to the following:

In accordance with the provisions of <u>N.J.A.C.</u> 14:9-7.3(c), the Petitioner shall file with the Board, no later than 45 days after the adjustment clause has been in effect for one year, or by February 28, 2019, whichever is earlier, a PSTAC true-up filing in connection with this proceeding. This filing shall include estimates of the OCUA costs for calendar year 2019. Copies of the true-up filing shall be served upon all Parties to the present proceeding.

The Board <u>HEREBY DIRECTS</u> the Company to file tariff pages conforming to the terms and conditions of the Stipulation and this Order within ten (10) days from the effective date of this Order.

The effective date of this Order is December 1, 2017 with rates to become effective January 1, 2018.

#### TO THE HONORABLE NEW JERSEY BOARD OF PUBLIC UTILITIES:

The Parties that have participated in this proceeding are Aqua New Jersey, Inc., the Maxim Wastewater Division ("Aqua," "Company," or "Petitioner"), the Division of Rate Counsel ("Rate Counsel"), and the Staff of the Board of Public Utilities ("Staff") (collectively, the "Parties"). There were no intervenors in this proceeding. As a result of an analysis of Aqua's Petition and exhibits, discovery conducted by Rate Counsel and Staff, conferences and negotiations, the Parties to this proceeding have come to the within agreement. The Parties hereto agree and stipulate as follows:

- 1. Petitioner operates a sewage collection and transmission system within a portion of the Township of Howell, New Jersey. Petitioner serves approximately 2,572 customers within its service territory. Aqua New Jersey, Inc. is a public utility corporation of the State of New Jersey subject to the jurisdiction of the Board of Public Utilities (the "Board"). Aqua's principal business office is located at 10 Black Forest Road, Hamilton, New Jersey 08691.
- 2. On August 9, 2017, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1 et seq., Aqua filed the above-captioned Petition with the Board, which was later assigned BPU Docket No. WR17080871, for approval of a purchased sewerage treatment adjustment clause ("PSTAC") true-up for calendar year 2016, and to set prospective rates for calendar year 2018 as required by N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1(d) and 14:9-7.7.
- 3. The matter was retained by the Board for review and disposition. The Parties agreed that a public comment hearing was not required because the Petitioner did not seek an increase in rates.
- 4. Petitioner's rates reflect the recovery of wastewater treatment charges imposed by the Ocean County Utilities Authority ("OCUA"). The current PSTAC tariff was approved by the Board in an Order in Docket No. WR16080737, dated November 30, 2016, which examined PSTAC revenues and expenses applicable to the period ending December 31, 2015 and set prospective rates for calendar year 2017.
- 5. In this proceeding, the Parties have examined the Company's actual revenues and actual OCUA expenses for calendar year 2016, the Company's projected OCUA expenses for 2018, as well as the costs of this proceeding. Based on the foregoing, the Parties have determined that the current PSTAC rate should be decreased to recover \$38,565 less in revenues.

  The \$38,565 PSTAC decrease was calculated based on the following components:

- a) an over-recovery of actual wastewater treatment charges of approximately \$66,818 for the calendar year ending December 31, 2016 (See Exhibit A, attached hereto, pages 1 to 3), with the interest on this over-recovery calculated to be \$2,980 (See Exhibit A, page 11);
- b) projected OCUA charges for 2018 of \$873,708 based on OCUA rates effective for 2017 (See Exhibit A, page 5);
- the total costs of this proceeding are deemed to be \$5,800 (See Exhibit A, page 4). These costs will be shared 50/50 between ratepayers and shareholders, resulting in a cost to customers of \$2,900 (See Exhibit A, page 7); and
- d) the pro forma PSTAC revenues at current rates are projected to be \$845,375 (See Exhibit A, page 6).
- 6. As required in N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.7, the Company has included in its filing an estimate of OCUA costs for calendar year 2018, which estimate has been used to determine the applicable PSTAC rate for 2018.
- Based on the estimated costs for 2018, the over-recovery for 2016 (including interest), and the costs of this proceeding, the Parties have agreed that Petitioner's current PSTAC rates on file with the Board should be decreased as indicated on Exhibit A. For the average residential customer, the total annual flat PSTAC rate will decrease from \$319.09 to \$304.53, or approximately 4.56% (See Exhibit A, page 8). With respect to the total annual rate for wastewater services, the total annual rate for the average residential customer will decrease from \$623.09 to \$608.53, or approximately 2.34% (See Exhibit A, page 10).

- 8. Consistent with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1 et seq., the Parties agree that the Company file with the Board a PSTAC petition to reconcile calendar year 2017 actual OCUA costs with the estimated OCUA costs (as reflected in the rates identified on Exhibit A) for the same period. Additionally, the Company will include in its filing an estimate of OCUA costs for calendar year 2019, which estimate will be used to determine the applicable PSTAC rate for 2019, as required in N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1(d) and 14:9-7.7.
- 9. The Parties have engaged in full discovery. The Parties agree that the within Stipulation reflects a mutual balancing of various issues and positions, and that it is being entered into in the spirit of compromise and to avoid protracted and costly litigation.
- 10. This Stipulation is the product of negotiations by the Parties, and it is an express condition of the settlement embodied by this Stipulation that it be presented to the Board in its entirety without modification or condition. It is also the intent of the Parties to this Stipulation that this settlement, once accepted and approved by the Board, shall govern all issues specified and agreed to herein. The Parties to this Stipulation specifically agree that if adopted in its entirety by the Board, no appeal shall be taken by them from the order adopting same as to those issues upon which the Parties have stipulated herein.
- 11. The Parties agree that each term within this Stipulation reflects a mutual balancing of various issues and positions and is intended to be accepted and approved in its entirety. Each term is vital to this Stipulation as a whole, since the Parties hereto expressly and jointly state that they would not have signed this Stipulation had any terms been modified in any way. In the event any particular aspect of this Stipulation is not accepted and approved by the Board, then any Party hereto materially affected thereby shall not be bound to proceed under this Stipulation.

12. The Parties further agree that with respect to any policy or other issues which were compromised in the spirit of reaching an agreement, none of the Parties shall be prohibited from, or prejudiced in, arguing a different policy or position before the Board in any other proceeding, as such agreements pertain only to this matter and to no other matter. It is specifically understood and agreed that this Stipulation represents a negotiated agreement and has been made exclusively for the purpose of this proceeding. Except as expressly provided herein, the Parties shall not be deemed to have approved, agreed to, or consented to any principle or methodology underlying or supposedly underlying any agreement provided herein in total or by specific item. The Parties further agree that this Stipulation is in no way binding upon them in any other proceeding, except to enforce the terms of this Stipulation.

13. This Stipulation may be executed in as many counterparts as there are Parties to this Stipulation, each of which counterparts shall be an original, but all of which shall constitute one and the same instrument.

Presented herein is this Authority's "Deficiency Notification" resulting from the regional sewerage service provided to your community during the 2018 calendar year. A "Deficiency" charge or credit is the correction to the Annual Charge billed to a Participant which results from adjusting the estimated sewage discharge to reflect the actual volume discharged in the calendar year. For more detailed information concerning "Deficiencies," please refer to Articles V and IX of the Service Agreement.

As indicated in this Authority's letter to you of January 25, 2018, the 2018 Annual Charge billed to your community was based upon an estimated sewage volume of 235 million gallons anticipated to be discharged to the Regional System. Our records indicate that during 2018 your community discharged 248.300 million gallons, or 13.300 million gallons more than the billed estimate. At the 2018 Bulk Rate of \$3,960, this results in a "Deficiency" amount due this Authority of \$52,668.00. This "Deficiency" will be added to the first installment of the 2018 Annual Charge.







### BY THE BOARD:

On August 10, 2018, Aqua New Jersey, Inc., Maxim Wastewater Division ("Maxim," "Company," or "Petitioner"), a public utility of the State of New Jersey, filed a verified petition with the Board of Public Utilities ("Board") pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1 to 7.7 for approval of a Purchased Wastewater (Sewerage) Treatment Adjustment Clause ("PSTAC") true-up for calendar year 2017, and to set prospective rates for calendar year 2019 as required by N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.7.1(d) and 7.7. The Company originally filed for an overall increase in PSTAC revenues totaling \$47,997 or approximately 5.92% above current PSTAC revenues of \$810,361.

Maxim is a wastewater utility engaged in the collection and transmission of sewage. Maxim serves approximately 2,586 customers within a portion of Howell Township, Monmouth County, New Jersey. The Ocean County Municipal Utilities Authority ("OCMUA") receives and treats all of the sewage transmitted by Maxim.

By this Order, the Board considers a Stipulation of Settlement ("Stipulation") executed by the Petitioner, the New Jersey Division of Rate Counsel ("Rate Counsel") and Board Staff ("Staff") (collectively, "Parties"), agreeing to an overall increase in Petitioner's PSTAC revenues totaling \$44,647 or approximately 5.49% above current PSTAC revenues of \$813,711.

### BACKGROUND/PROCEDURAL HISTORY

Petitioner's rates reflect the recovery of wastewater treatment charges imposed by OCMUA. The current PSTAC tariff was approved by the Board by Order dated November 21, 2017, in Docket No. WR17080871, which examined PSTAC revenues and expenses applicable to the period ending December 31, 2016 and set prospective rates for calendar year 2018.

On August 17, 2018, this matter was transmitted to the Office of Administrative Law ("OAL") as a contested case and was subsequently assigned to Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ") Tricia M. Caliguire. On September 13, 2018, a telephonic prehearing conference was conducted by ALJ Caliguire. After publication of notice in newspapers of general circulation in the Company's service territory, a public hearing was held on November 27, 2018, in Howell, New Jersey. No members of the public attended the hearing or filed written comments with the Board.

# STIPULATION<sup>2</sup>

Following discovery and settlement discussion, the Parties entered into the Stipulation that, among other things, provides for an overall increase in Maxim's PSTAC revenues totaling \$44,647, and are calculated based on the following components:

- a) An over-recovery of actual wastewater treatment charges of approximately \$21,106 for the calendar year ending December 31, 2017, with interest on this over-recovery calculated to be \$976, as set forth in Exhibit A of the Stipulation on pages 1-3 and 10, respectively;
- b) Projected OCMUA charges for 2019 of \$877,540 based on OCMUA rates effective for 2017 as set forth in Exhibit A of the Stipulation on, page 5;
- c) The total costs of this proceeding are deemed to be \$5,800 as set forth in Exhibit A of the Stipulation on page 4. These costs will be shared 50/50 between ratepayers and shareholders, resulting in a cost to customers of \$2,900 as set forth in Exhibit A of the Stipulation on page 7; and

d) The pro forma PSTAC present rate revenues are projected to be \$813,711 as set forth in Exhibit A of the Stipulation on page 6.

As required by N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.7, the Petitioner has included in its filing an estimate of OCMUA costs for calendar year 2019, which estimate has been used to determine the applicable PSTAC rate for 2019.

# **DISCUSSIONS AND FINDING**

Based on the estimated costs for 2019, discovery responses, the over-recovery for 2017 with interest, and the costs of this proceeding, there is a total overall increase in PSTAC revenues of \$44,647. The Parties have agreed that Petitioner's current PSTAC volumetric rate on file with the Board should be revised to reflect an increase from \$304.53 per thousand gallons to \$321.24 per thousand gallons or an increase of approximately 5.49%, pursuant to the rates indicated on page 8 of Exhibit A and the proposed tariff attached to the Stipulation. This reflects an increase in the PSTAC volumetric rate of \$16.71 or approximately 5.49%.

Based upon the Stipulation, the average residential customer will see an annual increase in a wastewater bill from \$608.53 to \$625.77, which equates to an overall increase in the total wastewater bill of \$17.24 or approximately 2.83%.

ALJ Caliguire issued her Initial Decision recommending adoption of the Stipulation executed by the Parties, finding that they had voluntarily agreed to the Stipulation and that the Stipulation fully disposes of all issues and is consistent with the law. Having reviewed the Initial Decision, as well as the Stipulation, the Board <u>HEREBY FINDS</u> that the Stipulation is reasonable, in the public interest, and in accordance with the law.

Therefore, the Board <u>HEREBY ADOPTS</u> the Initial Decision and the Stipulation, including all attachments and schedules, as its own, incorporating by reference the terms and conditions of the Stipulation, as if fully set forth at length herein, subject to the following:

In accordance with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.3(c), the Petitioner shall file with the Board, no later than 45 days after the adjustment clause has been in effect for one year, or by February 28, 2020, whichever is earlier, a PSTAC true-up filing in connection with this proceeding. This filing shall include estimates of the OCMUA costs for calendar year 2020. Copies of the true-up filing shall be served upon all Parties to the present proceeding.

The Board <u>HEREBY DIRECTS</u> the Company to file tariff pages conforming to the terms and conditions of the Stipulation and this Order within 5 days from the effective date of this Order.

The effective date of this Order is December 28, 2018 with rates to become effective January 1, 2019.

# TO THE HONORABLE NEW JERSEY BOARD OF PUBLIC UTILITIES:

The Parties that have participated in this proceeding are Aqua New Jersey. Inc., the Maxim Wastewater Division ("Aqua," "Company," or "Petitioner"), the Division of Rate Counsel ("Rate Counsel"), and the Staff of the Board of Public Utilities ("Staff") (collectively, the "Parties"). There were no intervenors in this proceeding. As a result of an analysis of Aqua's Petition and exhibits, discovery conducted by Rate Counsel and Staff, conferences and negotiations, the Parties to this proceeding have come to the within agreement. The Parties hereto agree and stipulate as follows:

- 1. Petitioner operates a sewage collection and transmission system within a portion of the Township of Howell, New Jersey. Petitioner serves approximately 2,586 customers within its service territory. Aqua New Jersey, Inc. is a public utility corporation of the State of New Jersey subject to the jurisdiction of the Board of Public Utilities (the "Board"). Aqua's principal business office is located at 10 Black Forest Road, Hamilton, New Jersey 08691.
- 2. On August 10, 2018 pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1 to -7.7, Aqua filed the above-captioned Petition with the Board, which was later assigned BPU Docket No. WR18080882. for approval of a purchased sewerage treatment adjustment clause ("PSTAC") true-up for calendar year 2017, and to set prospective rates for calendar year 2019 as required by N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1(d) and 14:9-7.7. Aqua will true-up 2018 PSTAC revenues and rates in its 2019 PSTAC filing, and commits that it will make this filing on a timely basis.
- 3. On August 17, 2018, the matter was transmitted to the Office of Administrative Law ("OAL") and was later assigned to the Honorable Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ") Tricia Caliguire for review and disposition.
- 4. On September 13, 2018, a telephonic prehearing conference was held before ALJ Caliguire, after which a Prehearing Order was issued by ALJ Caliguire on September 18, 2018.
- 5. A public comment hearing was scheduled for November 27, 2018, and all requisite notices were given, including notice by publication in the Asbury Park Press on October 30, 2018.
- 6. On November 5, 2018, a second telephonic prehearing conference was held before ALJ Caliguire.

The public hearing was originally scheduled for October 30, 2018, but in order to ensure all requisite notices could be timely given, the hearing was rescheduled.

- 7. On November 27, 2018 a public hearing was held at the Howell Township Municipal Building, at 5:30 p.m., over which ALJ Caliguire presided. No members of the public appeared.
- 8. Petitioner's rates reflect the recovery of wastewater treatment charges imposed by the Ocean County Utilities Authority ("OCUA"). The current PSTAC tariff was approved by the Board in an Order in Docket No. WR17080871, dated November 21, 2017, which examined PSTAC revenues and expenses applicable to the period ending December 31, 2016 and set prospective rates for calendar year 2018.
- 9. In this proceeding, the Parties have examined the Company's actual revenues and actual OCUA expenses for calendar year 2017, the Company's projected OCUA expenses for 2019, as well as the costs of this proceeding. Based on the foregoing, the Parties have determined that the current PSTAC rate should be increased to recover an additional \$44.647 in revenues. The \$44,647 PSTAC increase was calculated based on the following components:
- a) an over-recovery of actual wastewater treatment charges of approximately \$21,106 for the calendar year ending December 31, 2017 (See Exhibit A, attached hereto, pages 1 to 3), with the interest on this over-recovery calculated to be \$976 (See Exhibit A, page 11):
- b) projected OCUA charges for 2019 of \$877,540 based on OCUA rates effective for 2018 (See Exhibit A, page 5);
- c) the total costs of this proceeding are deemed to be \$5.800 (See Exhibit A. page 4). These costs will be shared 50/50 between ratepayers and shareholders, resulting in a cost to customers of \$2.900 (See Exhibit A, page 7); and
- d) the pro forma PSTAC revenues at current rates are projected to be \$813,711 (See Exhibit A, page 6).

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- 11. Based on the estimated costs for 2019, the over-recovery for 2017 (including interest), and the costs of this proceeding, the Parties have agreed that Petitioner's current PSTAC rates on file with the Board should be increased as indicated on Exhibit Λ. For the average residential customer, the total annual flat PSTAC rate will increase from \$304.53 to \$321.24, or approximately 5.49% (See Exhibit A, page 8). With respect to the total annual rate for wastewater services, the total annual rate for the average residential customer will increase from \$608.53 to \$625.77, or approximately 2.83% (See Exhibit A, page 10).
- 12. Consistent with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1 to -7.7, the Parties agree that the Company will file with the Board a PSTAC petition to reconcile calendar year 2018 actual OCUA costs with the estimated OCUA costs (as reflected in the rates identified on Exhibit A) for the same period. Additionally, the Company will include in its filing an estimate of OCUA costs for calendar year 2020, which estimate will be used to determine the applicable PSTAC rate for 2020, as required in N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1(d) and 14:9-7.7.
- 13. The Parties have engaged in full discovery. The Parties agree that the within Stipulation reflects a mutual balancing of various issues and positions, and that it is being entered into in the spirit of compromise and to avoid protracted and costly litigation.
- 14. This Stipulation is the product of negotiations by the Parties, and it is an express condition of the settlement embodied by this Stipulation that it be presented to the Board in its entirety without modification or condition. It is also the intent of the Parties to this Stipulation that this settlement, once accepted and approved by the Board, shall govern all issues specified

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and agreed to herein. The Parties to this Stipulation specifically agree that if adopted in its entirety by the Board, no appeal shall be taken by them from the order adopting same as to those issues upon which the Parties have stipulated herein.

- 15. The Parties agree that each term within this Stipulation reflects a mutual balancing of various issues and positions and is intended to be accepted and approved in its entirety. Each term is vital to this Stipulation as a whole, since the Parties hereto expressly and jointly state that they would not have signed this Stipulation had any terms been modified in any way. In the event any particular aspect of this Stipulation is not accepted and approved by the Board, then any Party hereto materially affected thereby shall not be bound to proceed under this Stipulation.
- 16. # TO THE HONORABLE NEW JERSEY BOARD OF PUBLIC UTILITIES:

The Parties that have participated in this proceeding are Aqua New Jersey, Inc., the Maxim Wastewater Division ("Aqua," "Company," or "Petitioner"), the Division of Rate Counsel ("Rate Counsel"), and the Staff of the Board of Public Utilities ("Staff") (collectively, the "Parties"). There were no intervenors in this proceeding. As a result of an analysis of Aqua's Petition and exhibits, discovery conducted by Rate Counsel and Staff, conferences and negotiations, the Parties to this proceeding have come to the within agreement. The Parties hereto agree and stipulate as follows:

- 1. Petitioner operates a sewage collection and transmission system within a portion of the Township of Howell, New Jersey. Petitioner serves approximately 2,586 customers within its service territory. Aqua New Jersey, Inc. is a public utility corporation of the State of New Jersey subject to the jurisdiction of the Board of Public Utilities (the "Board"). Aqua's principal business office is located at 10 Black Forest Road, Hamilton, New Jersey 08691.
- 2. On August 10, 2018 pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1 to -7.7, Aqua filed the above-captioned Petition with the Board, which was later assigned BPU Docket No. WR18080882. for approval of a purchased sewerage treatment adjustment clause ("PSTAC") true-up for calendar year 2017, and to set prospective rates for calendar year 2019 as required by N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1(d) and 14:9-7.7. Aqua will true-up 2018 PSTAC revenues and rates in its 2019 PSTAC filing, and commits that it will make this filing on a timely basis.
- 3. On August 17, 2018, the matter was transmitted to the Office of Administrative Law ("OAL") and was later assigned to the Honorable Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ") Tricia Caliguire for review and disposition.
- 4. On September 13, 2018, a telephonic prehearing conference was held before ALJ Caliguire, after which a Prehearing Order was issued by ALJ Caliguire on September 18, 2018.
- 5. A public comment hearing was scheduled for November 27, 2018, and all requisite notices were given, including notice by publication in the Asbury Park Press on October 30, 2018.
- 6. On November 5, 2018, a second telephonic prehearing conference was held before ALJ Caliguire.

The public hearing was originally scheduled for October 30, 2018, but in order to ensure all requisite notices could be timely given, the hearing was rescheduled.

- 7. On November 27, 2018 a public hearing was held at the Howell Township Municipal Building, at 5:30 p.m., over which ALJ Caliguire presided. No members of the public appeared.
- 8. Petitioner's rates reflect the recovery of wastewater treatment charges imposed by the Ocean County Utilities Authority ("OCUA"). The current PSTAC tariff was approved by the Board in an Order in Docket No. WR17080871, dated November 21, 2017, which examined PSTAC revenues and expenses applicable to the period ending December 31, 2016 and set prospective rates for calendar year 2018.
- 9. In this proceeding, the Parties have examined the Company's actual revenues and actual OCUA expenses for calendar year 2017, the Company's projected OCUA expenses for 2019, as well as the costs of this proceeding. Based on the foregoing, the Parties have determined that the current PSTAC rate should be increased to recover an additional \$44,647 in revenues. The \$44,647 PSTAC increase was calculated based on the following components:
- a) an over-recovery of actual wastewater treatment charges of approximately \$21,106 for the calendar year ending December 31, 2017 (See Exhibit A, attached hereto, pages 1 to 3), with the interest on this over-recovery calculated to be \$976 (See Exhibit A, page 11):
- b) projected OCUA charges for 2019 of \$877,540 based on OCUA rates
   effective for 2018 (See Exhibit Λ, page 5);
- c) the total costs of this proceeding are deemed to be \$5,800 (See Exhibit A, page 4). These costs will be shared 50/50 between ratepayers and shareholders, resulting in a cost to customers of \$2,900 (See Exhibit A, page 7); and
  - d) the pro forma PSTAC revenues at current rates are projected to be \$813,711 (See Exhibit A, page 6).

- 10. As required in N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.7, the Company has included in its filing an estimate of OCUA costs for calendar year 2019, which estimate has been used to determine the applicable PSTAC rate for 2019.
- 11. Based on the estimated costs for 2019, the over-recovery for 2017 (including interest), and the costs of this proceeding, the Parties have agreed that Petitioner's current PSTAC rates on file with the Board should be increased as indicated on Exhibit A. For the average residential customer, the total annual flat PSTAC rate will increase from \$304.53 to \$321.24, or approximately 5.49% (See Exhibit A, page 8). With respect to the total annual rate for wastewater services, the total annual rate for the average residential customer will increase from \$608.53 to \$625.77, or approximately 2.83% (See Exhibit A, page 10).
- 12. Consistent with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1 to -7.7, the Parties agree that the Company will file with the Board a PSTAC petition to reconcile calendar year 2018 actual OCUA costs with the estimated OCUA costs (as reflected in the rates identified on Exhibit A) for the same period. Additionally, the Company will include in its filing an estimate of OCUA costs for calendar year 2020, which estimate will be used to determine the applicable PSTAC rate for 2020, as required in N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1(d) and 14:9-7.7.
- 13. The Parties have engaged in full discovery. The Parties agree that the within Stipulation reflects a mutual balancing of various issues and positions, and that it is being entered into in the spirit of compromise and to avoid protracted and costly litigation.
- 14. This Stipulation is the product of negotiations by the Parties, and it is an express condition of the settlement embodied by this Stipulation that it be presented to the Board in its entirety without modification or condition. It is also the intent of the Parties to this Stipulation that this settlement, once accepted and approved by the Board, shall govern all issues specified

and agreed to herein. The Parties to this Stipulation specifically agree that if adopted in its entirety by the Board, no appeal shall be taken by them from the order adopting same as to those issues upon which the Parties have stipulated herein.

- 15. The Parties agree that each term within this Stipulation reflects a mutual balancing of various issues and positions and is intended to be accepted and approved in its entirety. Each term is vital to this Stipulation as a whole, since the Parties hereto expressly and jointly state that they would not have signed this Stipulation had any terms been modified in any way. In the event any particular aspect of this Stipulation is not accepted and approved by the Board, then any Party hereto materially affected thereby shall not be bound to proceed under this Stipulation.
- 16. The Parties further agree that with respect to any policy or other issues which were compromised in the spirit of reaching an agreement, none of the Parties shall be prohibited from, or prejudiced in, arguing a different policy or position before the Board in any other proceeding, as such agreements pertain only to this matter and to no other matter. It is specifically understood and agreed that this Stipulation represents a negotiated agreement and has been made exclusively for the purpose of this proceeding. Except as expressly provided herein, the Parties shall not be deemed to have approved, agreed to, or consented to any principle or methodology underlying or supposedly underlying any agreement provided herein in total or by specific item. The Parties further agree that this Stipulation is in no way binding upon them in any other proceeding, except to enforce the terms of this Stipulation.




